ALTERNATE PATHWAY DIPLOMA OPTIONS AND SEALS

- All students must earn a minimum of 22 credits to graduate in various subject areas, as well as pass Regents exams in each subject area (English, math, social studies, and science, plus one pathway assessment in one of the following areas: STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math), Humanities, CTE, The Arts, or Languages Other Than English (LOTE).


HOW DO I REGISTER?

 - Access codes can only be used once


When first logging on, enter your code in the 'New User' box, then follow the on-screen instructions.




Investigative occupations frequently involve working with ideas, and require an extensive amount of thinking. These occupations can involve searching for facts and figuring out problems mentally.
