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PROCEDURES

- 1. Students must have a valid permit in order to be enrolled in Driver Education.
- 2. Junior License/Permit holder restrictions: A student may only drive between 5 am and 9 pm and must be accompanied by a licensed parent/guardian, person in position of loco parentis, Driver Education teacher, or Driving School Instructor.
- 3. You should immediately notify your insurance carrier that your child has a permit and will be practice driving with your car. Remember, you are liable for your child's actions.
- 4. Become familiar with the course rules and requirements.
- 5. Once a student receives DMV documents from this course, if they request a second copy there will be a fee of \$25.00 per document.

REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Students must pass both lecture and road training of the Driver Education Courses separately, in order to obtain a Blue Card (MV 285).
- 2. All assignments must be complete in order to obtain a passing grade.
- 3. In order to provide Driver Education to the maximum number of students, the program is based on the minimum time requirements: 24 hours in the classroom and 24 hours in the car to qualify for the Blue Card.
- 4. Once the session begins, a student may not switch their schedule.

Any absences the student has must be made up. Make-up time can be accepted for two *combined absences only. Arrangements for make-up classes can be arranged by seeing the lecture teacher. When a student accepts a make-up assignment, it is the same as a regular class and counts as an absence if the student does not turn the assignment in.

*The maximum amount of classes a student can miss is two (2), which must be made up. (For example: if a student misses lecture and road on one day they have two absences. If they miss lecture the next day, they now have 3 total absences.)

BE AWARE THAT ANY STUDENT WITH 3 ABSENCES, EVEN IF THE PREVIOUS 2 ARE MADE-UP, WILL NOT BE ELIGIBLE FOR A BLUE CARD (MV – 285) AND WILL NOT BE REFUNDED FOR THE COURSE. THIS IS BASED ON CLASSES, NOT DAYS.

ALL STUDENTS MUST PRESENT A VALID LEARNERS PERMIT ON THE FIRST DAY OF CLASS, NO FLIP-FLOPS ARE ALLOWED DURING DRIVING & NO CELL PHONE USE DURING DRIVING OR OBSERVATION
