

HUFSD (K-12) Remote Learning Expectations

To support students and their families in creating an optimal environment for virtual learning, the Huntington School District has outlined expectations for all students to follow when learning from home. We ask that you please review these expectations with your child to prepare him/her for a successful start to the school year. These expectations will also be reviewed and reinforced by your child's classroom teacher.

PREPARATION

Students should:

- be ready to start their day, as they would if they were in the school building;
- eat prior to their scheduled class sessions to the greatest extent practicable;
- be prepared with all lesson materials prior to the start of the lesson;
- set up their Chromebook/work station in a quiet space where there is less chance of interruption or disruption.

PARTICIPATION & CONDUCT

Students should:

- participate routinely and ask questions for clarification as needed;
- comment in the 'chat' and/or live instruction sessions with **content-related items only**;
- use appropriate language at all times in chats, live instruction and/or online group work;
- turn off (mute) microphones when not participating in a discussion to limit background noise;
- use the chat feature to message the teacher privately, unless otherwise directed by the teacher;
- direct all comments to the classroom teacher and not to peers;
- follow teacher instructions throughout the session;
- remember that attendance and participation, as well as timely submission of assignments, will be taken into consideration for assessment purposes;
- understand the acceptable use policy and adhere to the HUFSD Code of Conduct when working in an online setting.

CONFIDENTIALITY

Students should:

- share his/her screen only if asked to do so by the teacher;
- not record or take screenshots during the session;
- turn their cameras on or off per teacher direction;
- keep login and class code information confidential.
