JOB TIPS

Sooner or later, you're going to realize that in order to land the right job, or any job there are some basic things you need to keep in mind. Read on for more information on how to land your next job:

1/ Build a resume: A resume should be one sheet of paper that paints a picture of who you are. To get started you can go on "Resume Builder" in a Word doc. Be sure to include:

- Your basic info: name, address, phone, email
- Education: the name and address of your high school, what grade you are in, and any specific courses
- Activities: clubs, sports, or any other extra-curricular activities
- Community service: include volunteer work in and out of school. Include your role and brief description of what you do.
- Work experience: any summer or school-year jobs
- Accolades: any academic or nonacademic awards or honors you've received
- 2/ Interview tips: This is what will help you also stand out from the crowd. On an interview be sure to smile, give a firm handshake, and make plenty of direct eye contact. Make sure you have good posture, which conveys confidence. Lastly, you can talk about previous experiences to show how you would be a good fit for the job.
- 3/ Spread out a wide net: In order to land a job, you need to be actively searching. Talk to your friends or teachers to get the word out that you are looking for a job. You can give out your resume to different businesses, and go door to door on a Saturday to fill out applications.

Preparing for High School

Feeling anxious or excited about starting High School in the fall? Well don't worry because you are going to have a great time during these next four years of your life. Here are some tips to make sure you feel calm and prepared for your first few days of 9th grade:

- 1/ Go to Orientation Day: Tour the school and run through the potential routes you could take to get from class to class on your schedule.
- 2/ Meet your teachers and School Counselor in advance: Introduce yourself and let your counselor know if you have any specific concerns. They are here to help!
