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Letter from the Supervisor

Dear Friends,

The Town of Huntington’s ongoing effort to revitalize Huntington Station is one of its most important community initiatives. As noted on “Source the Station” (sourcethestation.com), the website developed in partnership with Renaissance Downtowns to present the Town’s new crowdsourced placemaking approach to revitalization, this effort is designed to “ensure that the future of the Huntington Station downtown is vibrant, inspiring and representative of its community’s shared values, based on the triple bottom line of being economically, socially and environmentally sustainable.” Among the many “smart growth” principles being enlisted in this approach is the development of a public infrastructure of “beautiful places” that will become walkable destinations within the community, helping to ensure its “livability.”

One such “beautiful place” currently taking shape in the community is a new landscaped pedestrian plaza on the southeast corner of the intersection of New York Avenue and Olive Street. Centrally located on this new plaza will be a distinctive public artwork being created specifically for this site. *Generations*, the design proposal created by sculptor Madeline Weiner – the artist selected for this project following careful review of submissions from 54 artists – was approved by the Town Board last year. The *Generations* design proposes carving from dolomitic limestone a grouping of “bench people” – larger-than-life figurative sculptures that will also serve as benches for visitors to the plaza. www.huntingtonny.gov. Support for this project has been received from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development and from Suffolk County’s Downtown Revitalization Grant program.

I invite you to follow the fascinating process of creation of *Generations* as it unfolds – from the quarrying of huge blocks of limestone in Wiarton, Canada, last fall, to the gradual emergence of the figures from the stone blocks under the skilled hands of the artist in her Denver studio, to its transportation across the country for final installation on the Plaza later this year. Thanks to continued funding approved by the Town Board in the 2013 Budget, the 48th Huntington Summer Arts Festival will return to the Chapin Rainbow Stage in Heckscher Park. The 2013 edition of the popular series of free concerts will open the latter part of June with performances scheduled into mid-August. “We are delighted the arts and culture funding has been sustained,” said Executive Director Diana Cherryholmes. “We’ll use every dollar wisely and I anticipate another exciting season full of wonderful performances and hopefully a few surprises!”

The Festival will continue with a similar format to prior years, and will feature a mix of established and emerging artists on tour, and superb local artistry from the worlds of music, dance and theatre. Family Shows will continue on Tuesday evenings, as will weekly performances by the outstanding Huntington Community Band at Heckscher Park and the Northport Community Band at the Bandshell in Northport Harbor.

African Art Exchange

In Summer of 2012, the Arts in Education department was approached by teacher Susan Cucchiara of Bellerose Avenue Elementary school and PTA parent Lisa Schilling. The school wanted to engage in an ‘Art Exchange’ program with a school on the African continent. Ms Cucchiara has been a participating teacher in the JOURNEY program for years – borrowing the Discovery Lending chests and attending several of the annual Cultural Arts Workshops for teachers. She has also served on advisory committees for JOURNEY over the years.

As it turns out, one of Huntington Arts Council summer interns was Koro Koroye from Hofstra University. HAC supporters may remember that Koro as a spoken word performer that was a finalist in our 2012 Got Talent Long Island contest. Ms. Koroye helped the Arts in Education dept. over the summer and she is a Nigerian citizen who is

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doing graduate work in education at Hofstra University.

With help from Peggy Low, Arts in Education coordinator, and Ms. Schilling, Ms. Koroye was able to approach a school in Lagos Nigeria about participating in the ‘Art Exchange’ program. The program will run much like a ‘Pen Pal’ program – only with works of art. Bellerose Avenue school principal Barbara Falotico made contact with Bethesda Child Support Agency and created a list of subject matter with the program director Ms Ijeoma Ukwadinachi . The subject matter for potential artworks proved tricky as the students at Bethesda live quite different lives than students in Northport: the school services poor communities and offer free and quality education to Orphans and Vulnerable Children. According to Avert.org, 2,500,000 children were orphans in Nigeria in 2009.

The students in Lagos and Northport are creating artworks based on an agreed subject list. Plans for the exchange of artworks and displaying artworks at each location in Logos and Northport are underway. Ms. Schilling organized a community art supply drive and Northport parents did an outstanding job of donating many pounds of supplies and free shipping to the Bethesda school.

The Huntington Arts Council is proud and excited to facilitate this program and we are all looking forward to display of the artworks in Northport in February 2013. It is a perfect extension of the JOURNEY program’s 28 year mission to bring world cultures into the classroom through the arts.

Report on 2012 Cultural Arts Workshops

Huntington High School was the location for the **2012 Cultural Arts Workshops for Teachers**. Huntington School District has been a long time partner in the JOURNEY program and teachers there attend workshops and reserve Discovery Lending chests. Their Arts in Education committee has made use of the Visiting Artists program every year.

A look back at each workshop:

Hip-Hop - A Tool for Literacy held on October 3rd, with teacher and performer Linda H. Humes of Yaffa Cultural Arts Inc. and John Jay College, NYC. Linda led the workshop with the history of Hip-Hop and had all 25 teachers creating and performing their own spoken word verses. Many teachers reported using the techniques they learned immediately upon return to their classes that week.

On October 10th, Enduring Indian Traditions - from Ancient Times to Bollywood was led by musician Dr. Rohini Ramanathan of India Heritage Institute of LI. The long rich path that is India’s cultural history was explored and teachers participated in writing from the Indian alphabet. Dr. Ramanathan also gave a demonstration of traditional Indian vocal music and brought some instruments from her personal collection.

Steelpan Drum - Dissent to Cultural Identity was led by musician Rudyard Crichlow of Casplash Band. The little known

history of Steelpan was shown in a series of interviews and photos in a digital slide presentation. Teachers all created music together with the six large steelpans Rudy brought, including our classroom and visual arts teachers!

Teacher Artists Sungsook Setton demonstrated Brush Painting Traditions from Asia on October 24th. Teachers were treated to look at Sungsook’s portfolio of original works, her personal sketch book, a demonstration of techniques and the opportunity for each teacher to try his/her own hand at brush painting on rice paper.

The Main Street Petite Gallery was the location of the final workshop with Tamara and the Shadow Theater of Java. After Superstorm Sandy, Tamara Fielding was kind enough to reschedule this workshop to November 27th. The gallery was the perfect location for this workshop, as Tamara brought her museum quality collection of shadow puppets she has collected from Indonesia. Teachers were able to handle the puppets, gain knowledge of how shadow theater is performed in Java, look at maps of Indonesia and inspect handmade fabrics from this country.

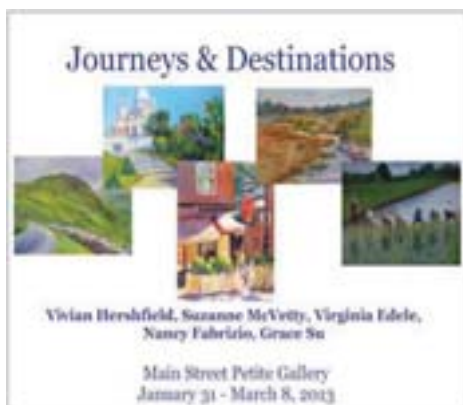
