JOVIA'S FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP is a \$3,000 scholarship awarded to high school seniors. Eligible seniors must complete an essay, provide proof of 50 community service hours, participate in 3 extracurricular activities and/or sports, and be a NEFCU member. Family Scholarship applicants will be eligible to apply for Jovia's Premier Scholarship which awards one \$50,000 scholarship paid out over four years. Deadline is May 1st.

JULIE PEIERLS SCHOLARSHIP, sponsored by Theatre Three, in the amount of \$1,000, will be presented to a Long Island senior planning to pursue a career in professional theatre, as well as pursue theatrical education at a college as a musical theatre major or at a conservatory. Completed application, audition, and interview are required. Applications are available at <u>www.theatrethree.com</u>. Deadline is June 1st.

****HUNTINGTON LIONS CLUB** will award a \$5,000 scholarship, payable in installments. The award will be based on financial need, service to the community and school, academic accomplishments, and acceptance to an accredited academic institution. Application, with required attachments, must be sent together to local Member fair or to the NYSSA for endorsement. Deadline is April 2nd.

LONG ISLAND UNIVERSITY'S HOPE SCHOLARS PROGRAM provides students with career and internship connections, study abroad opportunities, research collaboration, personal mentorship, enrichment activities, community engagement, and full tuition through LIU scholarships and state/federal financial aid.
