COLLEGE ADMISSION CRITERIA

4 year colleges

- Transcript
- Standardized test scores (OR test optional www.fairtest.org)
- Extracurricular activities
- Recommendations
- Essay
- Portfolio/audition

2 year colleges

- Transcript
- Standardized tests (may used for placement)

COLLEGE APPLICATION OPTIONS

- Regular Decision: "I am interested and if accepted, I might want to attend."
- Early Action: "I am very interested and if accepted, I will most likely attend."
- **Early Decision**: "It's true love, and if accepted, I *must attend*, because it is *contractually binding*." (ED I & II)
- Single Choice/Restrictive Early Action: "I'm very interested, and you're the one and only school I may apply to early." (Non-binding)
- Rolling Admission: "I must apply as soon as possible because applications are reviewed and decisions are made on a rolling basis."

HOW DOES THE COLLEGE APPLICATION PROCESS BEGIN?

- Complete Application Forms
 - Records Release Form
 - Common Application/Coalition Application
 - Individual college applications

- Teacher recommendations and evaluations
- Mid-year report
- Optional Report (if applicable)
- Essay
- Activity résumé/sheet
- Supplemental essay (individual colleges)
- Early Decision (ED) contract and Final Report

COLLEGE APPLICATION PROCEDURES

All college application related materials will be submitted electronically through Naviance. This includes the following:

- Transcripts
 - SRAR: Self Reported Academic Record
- Teacher recommendations and evaluation forms
- Counselor recommendations and Secondary School Reports
- Other relevant college documents (Early Decision agreements, Fee Waivers, etc.)


THE COALITION APPLICATION

- The platform provides a single, centralized toolkit for students to organize, build, and refine their applications to numerous institutions. There are currently over 150 Coalition member colleges across the country.
- The application is completed online and can be accessed by logging onto www.coalitionforcollegeaccess.org. Some schools will accept the Coalition application in addition to other applications, such as the Common Application, while other schools are exclusive and therefore, require students to use the Coalition application.




COMMON APPLICATION FERPA



COMMON APPLICATION MATCHING WITH NAVIANCE





- 1 counselor recommendation
 - Mrs. Walsh will write and forward to all Common Application colleges and non Common Application colleges where applicable

SHOULD I TEST? SHOULD I SEND MY SCORES?

- Test optional: applicant has the option of submitting standardized test scores for consideration with their application
- Test blind: scores will not be reviewed for any candidate for admission. The goal of a test-blind policy is to remove the pressure on students to provide a score if some others are doing so.
- Test flexible: refers to adjustments to testing requirements, particularly in locations where testing opportunities were limited

STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK (SUNY)

- 64 campuses
 - 30 community colleges
- 7,000+ academic programs
- 370K students enrolled in the SUNY system (4 and 2 year colleges)
- Varying academic requirements
 - SUNY has temporarily suspended SAT/ACT testing requirements for students applying for admission to a SUNY bachelor's degree-granting college. You may now decide whether or not to include your scores for admission consideration at each college to which you apply.
 - If you believe your scores are an accurate representation of your ability, SUNY colleges can consider them along with all other materials in your application file. If you think your scores do not represent your abilities, SUNY colleges can holistically evaluate your application without considering them.

- Various deadlines (EA, ED, RD or rolling)

CITY UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK (CUNY)

- 14 senior colleges
- 10 community colleges
- 1,750+ programs of study
- 270K students enrolled in the CUNY system (2 and 4 year colleges)
- Varying academic requirements
 - CUNY has revised its testing policy to test optional effective fall 2023 through spring 2025. First-year applicants can choose whether to submit SAT or ACT exam scores as part of their application. The admission decision will be based primarily on a student's academic preparation in high school, including overall grade-point-average, course grades and the academic rigor of their high school curriculum. Students should carefully consider whether they would like to send their test scores:
 - If a student has a particularly strong academic record and believes that their standardized exam scores do not reflect their full academic potential, they may elect not to send SAT or ACT exam scores to CUNY.
 - If a student feels that standardized test scores improve their overall academic record, we invite them to send test scores.
 - The absence of SAT or ACT exam scores cannot be used to deny a student admission.
- Macaulay Honors College at 8 senior colleges (11/16/23 deadline-10/24/23 HHS deadline)
- One application and one fee used for up to 6 campuses
- February 1st deadline (general freshman admission) and then rolling admission on a space available basis, 1/10/24 HHS suggested deadline

- Available in the College Office and on the Google Classroom
- Student and parent/guardian signature required
- Checklist
- 1 RRF/college
- RRF due to the College Office 15 school days before the application deadline. May be dropped off or emailed.



FINANCIAL AID



- Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)
 - Federal student financial aid, such as Pell grant, student loans, and college work-study. In addition, most states and schools use FAFSA information to award their financial aid.
 - Available December 2023
 - www.studentaid.gov
- NYS Tuition Assistance Program (TAP)
 - New York's grant program that helps eligible NYS residents attending NYS institutions
 - Grant based upon NYS taxable income
 - Available December 2023 (FAFSA MUST BE COMPLETED FIRST) www.hesc.ny.gov/tap
- CSS/ Financial Aid Profile
 - Nearly 400 colleges & universities use the profile to distribute nonfederal student aid funds
 - Available 10/01/2023
