Christine Affrunti

Christine Affrunti has been a Huntington health education teacher since September 2016. A graduate of Northport High School, she obtained undergraduate and graduate degrees at Adelphi University in health education. She earlier worked as a leave replacement health teacher at Hempstead High School and as a substitute in six different Long Island districts. She has also worked as a private health tutor and as an American Sign Language tutor.

Richard Agnello

Richard Agnello has been a Huntington health education teacher since September 2002. He is a graduate of Island Trees High School and obtained an undergraduate degree at McDaniel College and a graduate degree at Hofstra University. He holds certifications in physical education and health education.

Mr. Agnello has coached middle school boy's and girl's basketball and track and field.

Marissa Bergmann has been a Huntington physical education teacher since September 2014. A member of Huntington High School's Class of 2003, she earned an undergraduate degree at Purdue University in elementary education with a minor in reading and obtained a master's degree at Stony Brook University in liberal studies with a concentration in health science.

Ms. Bergmann has coached high school basketball and field hockey and middle school soccer and lacrosse. She has served as treasurer of the Suffolk County Girls' Basketball Coaches Association.

Lauren Blackburn

Lauren Blackburn has been a Huntington UFSD faculty member since September 2021. She worked as a health teacher at the high school and Jack Abrams STEM Magnet School in 2021/22 and has been a high school physical education teacher since September 2022.

Ms. Blackburn obtained an undergraduate degree at SUNY Cortland and a master's degree at Adelphi University with certificates in both adapted physical education and health education. She coaches varsity Unified bowling, JV girls' volleyball and lacrosse and middle school girls' volleyball. She is also co-advisor to the high school's Grandfriends club.

Prior to coming to Huntington, Ms. Blackburn was a teaching assistant and coach at Cold Spring Harbor. A graduate of Walt Whitman High School, she is a lifelong Huntington resident.

Maria Canino

Maria Canino has been a Huntington physical education teacher since September 2014. A member of Huntington High School's Class of 2007, she obtained undergraduate and graduate degrees from Adelphi University and Stony Brook University, respectively. She is also certified in health education. She obtained her school administrator certification through Stony Brook University.

Ms. Canino is the varsity girls' wrestling coach and JV girls' soccer coach. She has also coached JV girls' volleyball and softball. She is also an active member of the high school's Natural Helpers club. She regularly attends and has been a guest speaker at the NYS AHPERD conference.

Karen Fischer

Karen Fischer has been a Huntington physical education teacher since September 1995. A member of Huntington High School's Class of 1989, she played soccer, basketball and softball for the Blue Devils. Jim Hoops

Jim Hoops assumed the position of district director of health, physical education and athletics on July 1, 2021. He previously served for three years as coordinator of physical education, athletics and special projects. He has worked full-time in the district since April 1984 and has been a physical education teacher since September 1990. He is also certified as a social studies teacher.
