NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING, BUDGET VOTE AND ELECTION OF THE HUNTINGTON UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT AND THE HUNTINGTON PUBLIC LIBRARY TOWN OF HUNTINGTON, COUNTY OF SUFFOLK, NEW YORK

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that pursuant to the Governor of the State of New York's Executive Order 202.26 (hereinafter, "Executive Order"), a Public Hearing of the qualified voters of the Huntington Union Free School District, Town of Huntington, County of Suffolk, New York, will be held remotely on June 1, 2020 at 7:30PM, prevailing time, for the transaction of business as authorized by the Education Law, including the following items:

- 1. To present to the voters a detailed statement (proposed budget) of the amount of money which will be required for the 2020-2021 fiscal year.
- 2. To discuss all the items hereinafter set forth to be voted upon by absentee ballot pursuant to Executive Order 202.26 for the Budget Vote and Election to be held on Tuesday, June 9, 2020.
- 3. To transact such other business as may properly come before the meeting pursuant to Education Law of the State of New York and acts amendatory thereto.

A copy of the proposed budget shall be made available to residents of the School District beginning on May 26, 2020 on the District's website at www.hufsd.edu While Education Law §1716(2) requires the budget also be made available at School District offices, any public library/free association library within the District, and the polling place, this year that will not be possible due to Executive Order 202.26 and the prevalence of the COVID-19 virus and potential for spread through our personal interaction.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that pursuant to Executive Order 202.26, the Budget Vote and Election of Board of Education members, and the election of one (1) Trustee to the Library Board of Trustees, will be held on Tuesday, June 9, 2020. The Executive Order directs that the budget vote and election be conducted by an absentee ballot process in lieu of in-person voting and permits the Library Election to be conducted in conjunction with the Budget Vote and Election. Therefore, there will be no voting at the polls for this year's annual School Budget Vote and Election or Library Election. The District will mail absentee ballots with a postage paid return envelope to qualified voters. In order to be counted, absentee ballots must be received in the office of the District Clerk by 5:00 p.m. on June 9, 2020. Thus, every qualified voter shall vote by absentee ballot on the following items:

- 1. To adopt the annual budget of the school district for the fiscal year 2020-2021 and to authorize the requisite portion thereof to be raised by taxation on the taxable property of the District.
- 2. To vote on the following proposition:

PROPOSITION: Authorizing the expenditure of an amount not to exceed three million six hundred forty thousand dollars (\$3,640,000) from Capital Reserve (Building Improvement) Funds consisting of (ninety-eight thousand nine hundred eighteen dollars (\$98,918) from the Capital Reserve Fund established on May 20, 2008; one million three hundred fifty eight thousand three hundred and three dollars (\$1,358,303) from the Capital Reserve Fund established on May 21, 2013; and two million one hundred eighty two thousand seven hundred seventy nine dollars (\$2,182,779) from the Capital Reserve Fund established on May 16, 2017) to finance the, (1) reconstruction of classrooms at J. Taylor Finley Middle School; (2) the replacement of two (2) boilers at J. Taylor Finley Middle School; (3) the partial replacement of roofing at Huntington High School; (4) auditorium and flooring reconstruction at Jack Abrams STEM Magnet School; (5) the construction of a rooftop solar power system at Southdown Primary School and (6) \$20,000 for the reconstruction of a substantial portion of the corridors, hallways and/or floors at J. Taylor Finley Middle School (from the \$600,000 previously authorized by voters on May 21, 2019 for a locker project at J. Taylor Finley Middle School), together with such incidental and ancillary work, including related projects, site work and abatement, if necessary, and such architect, construction management and legal costs to complete the projects provided the details and costs of the components of the capital improvements/projects may be reallocated among such components/projects as the Board of Education shall determine to be in the best interest of the District.

- 3. To elect two (2) members of the Board of Education of the Huntington Union Free School District for a three (3) year term commencing July 1, 2020, and expiring on June 30, 2023.
- 4. To elect one (1) member of the Library Board of Trustees for a five year term commencing July 1, 2020 and expiring on June 30, 2025.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that personal registration of voters is required either pursuant to Section 2014 of the New York State Education Law or pursuant to Article 5 of the New York State Election Law. If a voter has heretofore registered pursuant to Section 2014 of the New York State Education Law and has voted at any annual or special district meeting within the past four (4) calendar years, such voter is eligible to vote at this election; if a voter is registered and eligible to vote pursuant to Article 5 of the New York State Election Law, such voter is also eligible to vote at this election. All other persons who wish to vote must register online no later than May 26, 2020. There is no provision for inperson registration for this election. Those wishing to register to vote should visit https://www.dmv.ny.gov/more-info/electronic-voter-registration-application in order to do so online.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that pursuant to Chapter 258 of the Laws of Section 2008, Section 495 was added to the Real Property Tax Law and requires the School District to attach to its proposed budget an exemption report. Said exemption report, which will also become part of the final budget, will show how much the total assessed value on the final assessment roll used in the budgetary process is exempt from taxation, list every type of exemption granted, identify by statutory authority, and show: (a) the cumulative impact

of each type of exemption expressed either as a dollar amount of assessed value or as a percentage of the total assessed value on the roll; (b) the cumulative amount expected to be received from recipients of each type of exemption as payments in lieu of taxes or other payments for municipal services; and (c) the cumulative impact of all exemptions granted. The exemption report shall be posted on any bulletin board maintained by the District for public notices and on any website maintained by the District.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that pursuant to Executive Order 202.26, petitions nominating candidates for the office of member of the Board of Education shall be filed with and received by the District Clerk at 50 Tower Street, Huntington Station, NY 11746, not later than Monday, May 11, 2020 at 5:00 p.m., prevailing time. The petition may be filed by emailing it to the District Clerk at jomiranda@hufsd.edu The petition must be received by the District Clerk no later than Monday, May 11, 2020 at 5:00 p.m. Each petition shall: (1) be directed to the Clerk of the School District, (2) identify which trustee position they are running for (*i.e.*, Board of Education or Library Board), and (3) state the name and residence of the candidate. Vacancies on the Board of Education are not considered separate, specific offices; candidates run at large. As per Executive Order 202.26, there is no minimum number of signatures required on the petition for the June 9, 2020 Budget Vote and Election.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that military voters who are qualified voters of the Huntington Union Free School District may request an application for a military ballot from the District Clerk by mail to the Office of the District Clerk, 50 Tower Street or by email to the District Clerk at jomiranda@hufsd.edu or fax sent to 631-423-3447. In such request, the military voter may indicate their preference for receiving the application by mail, fax or email. A military voter must return the original military ballot application by mail to the Office of the District Clerk at 50 Tower Street, Huntington Station, NY 11746. In order for a military voter to be issued a military ballot, a valid military ballot application must be received in the office of the District Clerk no later than 5:00 p.m. on May 14, 2020. Military ballot applications received in accordance with the foregoing will be processed in the same manner as a non-military ballot application under §2018-a of the Education Law. The application for military ballots may include the military voter's preference for receipt of the military ballot by mail, fax or email.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, a military voter's original military ballot must be returned by mail to the office of the District Clerk at P.O. Box 1500, Huntington, NY 11743. Military ballots shall be canvassed if they are received by the District Clerk before 5:00 p.m. on June 9, 2020 showing a cancellation mark of the United States Postal Service or a foreign country's postal service, or showing a dated endorsement of receipt by another agency of the United States Government; or received not later than 5:00 p.m. on June 9, 2020 and signed and dated by the military voter and one witness thereto, with a date which is ascertained to be not later than the day before the election.

AND FURTHER NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that pursuant to a rule adopted by the Board of Education in accordance with §2035 of the Education Law, any referenda or propositions to change the number of Board of Education members, or a bond issue for capital improvements, or any other petition required by law to be stated in the Notice of

Annual Meeting and Election must be filed with the District Clerk at 50 Tower Street, Huntington Station, NY 11746, not later than 5:00 p.m., prevailing time, on Friday, April 10, 2020. Any other petition, except those petitions required by law to be stated in the Notice of Annual Meeting and Election, must be filed with the District Clerk at the 50 Tower Street, Huntington Station, NY 11746, no later than 5:00 p.m., prevailing time on April 10, 2020. All such petitions must be typed or printed in the English language; must be directed to the Clerk of the School District; must be signed by at least 67 qualified voters of the District (representing the greater of 25 or 5% of the number of voters who voted in the previous annual election); and must legibly state the name of each signer. However, the School Board will not entertain any petition to place before the voters any proposition the purpose of which is not within the powers of the voters to determine, which is unlawful or any proposition which fails to include a specific appropriation where the expenditure of monies is required by the proposition, or where other valid reason exists for excluding the proposition from the ballot.
