Jefferson Primary School (V. Capitulo-Saide/C. Schaeffer/J. Gregory/E. Rubin-Perez)

- Goal this year was to focus on building a positive relationship between our families and staff
- Accomplished with Welcoming Committee and Parent buddles for our new families, parent workshops for our ELL, translated all of the items sent home to families
- 'A Poem in a Pocket' day, Walk for Alzheimer's, Celebrating our 60th Anniversary, Dual Language Social, field days this year
- PTA Bingo Night, Spring Fling, Field Day T-Shirts and fundraising efforts
- Mr. Rubin-Perez working with town having an event on June 6 celebrating pride. Inviting district to participate. DEI focuses on all students feeling welcomed and included.

Flower Hill Primary School (Lucia Laguarda / Debra Ravo)

- Goals to increase new engagement opportunities for students to increase social and emotional learning experiences. Also, to maximize home to school communication and implementing new culturally responsive strategies.

- 'On A Roll' program acknowledging students who have increased their average. Currently have over 50 students being honored.
- Mentoring program. Paired up selected students with teacher volunteers (not a teacher of the student). The assigned teacher meets with their assigned student on a weekly basis one period each week. They talk, share and build a supportive relationship.
- Book Fair, 8th grade dance, faculty fundraiser volleyball game
- Google Survey for 6th grade students asking concerns they have for transitioning into middle school.

Huntington High School (Edie Pulizzotto / Suzi Biagi)

- Working on the Business Connection plan, No Homework Nights in the community.
- Spring concerts were phenomenal, Musical 42nd Street was amazing, Mock Trial Team are Suffolk County Champions and are going to state finals,
- Grand Friend had a senior prom at Sunrise Adult Living Center, had a band and chef make the food, and had a prom king and queen.
- K Factor, teachers made a video that is so ridiculous and embarrassing,
- AWAD training, has been working with Woodhull

Assistant Superintendent for Curriculum & Instruction (Beth McCoy)

- Applying for another grant through the Office of Mental Health, \$500k per year for 5 years, Mrs. Rich has taken the lead on the grant writing. Three main goals for the grant is to:
 - expand a CBO (community based organization) partnership, which is a requirement. Looking to expand relationship with Family Service League, hire additional social workers to support the needs of the students
 - create a resource packet that we can hand to families that has a list of materials and resources that are available for them with regard to support they may need outside of the school district.
 - implement the advisory period into the high school and provide training for teachers, purchase materials for teachers.
- We were approved to implement a new diagnostic assessment system at FMS. Will give us more information as to student's needs are, what we need to do to support them into closing any gaps and also challenging them at a higher level.
- Implementing a new elementary math curriculum
- Investigating 'No Place for Hate' for next year
