 - Codes will be distributed in the College Office beginning tomorrow, March 1, 2012
 - Use your code to create a personal account
 - Codes are random and alphanumeric for security reasons
 - Codes can be used only once
 - Parent account codes will be given to students
 - ▶ When first logging on, enter your code in the 'New User' box, then follow on-screen instructions
 - ▶ On subsequent visits, sign in using the 'Returning User' box


