New York State School Boards Association (NYSSBA) Convention

Mr. McGrath reported that he attended a NYSSBA Convention in New York City and had met with vendors regarding portable classrooms. Mr. McGrath will share this information after the architect's presentation.

PUBLIC COMMENTARY

Several parents and residents had comments as listed below:

Several comments were made about outside organizations using our fields and facilities. Extensive discussion followed.

There were several comments made by parents regarding the Dual Language Program. Discussion followed.

A resident asked if the search for Mr. O'Brien's replacement had started already. Mr. O'Brien responded that the search would be started after the holidays. This resident also commented that he would like to see our students do more in the areas of science and technology and would like to see money put into the budget for this.

There was a comment on Cablevision being used in the schools. Mr. Grackin responded.

Another resident commented that he would like to see the children outside for recess time whenever possible and wanted to know the guidelines for outdoor recess. Mrs. Stokkers, Principal of Huntington Intermediate School, responded that in her building it is an issue of blacktop and the grounds being muddy. The Board will look into the guidelines.

ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION/ACTION

Burton, Behrendt, Smith Architects - Spatial Needs Analysis Report

Larry Salvesen of Burton, Behrendt, Smith Architects presented an analysis with the focus on long term needs. A detailed analysis was presented on two options, as requested by the Board of Education. Extensive discussion followed.

Victims Information Bureau of Suffolk, Inc. (VIBS) Proposal

Mr. O'Brien updated the Board of Education about a program through VIBS that would be made available to our students after school. This program would provide counseling for a variety of issues. The proposals are being reviewed by school counsel and will be presented to the Board at a future date for approval.

Math Curriculum

Wayne Edwards, Director of Mathematics, presented a proposal to start acceleration in the 8^{th} grade instead of 7^{th} grade. Mr. Edwards explained the changes the state has initiated and why this proposal was brought before the Board of Education. Extensive discussion followed and the Board decided to table this proposal at this time.
