REGULAR MEETING MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION HUNTINGTON U.F.S.D.

February 9, 2009

The Regular Meeting of the Board of Education of the Huntington Union Free School District was held on Monday, February 9, 2009 at Jack Abrams Intermediate School, Lowndes Avenue, Huntington Station, New York. The meeting was called to order at 6:37 p.m.

ROLL CALL

There were present Board of Education Members: Dwyer, Rogan, Benè, Black, Brown, McGrath, Paci; Ms. Aloe, Superintendent Finello, Mr. Grackin, Dr. Giani, Dr. Lacey, and Mrs. Troffa. Mr. McGrath was absent.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

A MOTION was made by Mrs. Rogan and seconded by Mrs. Benè to go into Executive Session to discuss a special education issue, an impartial hearing issue and an issue with students at Finley Middle School.

MOTION carried.

At 6:37 p.m. the Board of Education went into Executive Session.

At 7:55 p.m. Mr. Dwyer reconvened the meeting.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mr. Dwyer led the Board of Education and the others present in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

EMERGENCY EVACUATION PROCEDURE

Mr. Dwyer discussed the exits to be used in the event of any emergency.

SMOKE-FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT

Mr. Dwyer announced that the Huntington Union Free School District is a smoke-free district and smoking is prohibited in all buildings and on school grounds. Mr. Dwyer also requested that all cell phones be turned off or set to vibrate.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A MOTION was made by Mrs. Brown and seconded by Mrs. Rogan to approve the Minutes of the Board of Education Meeting of January 26, 2009.

COMMUNICATIONS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

Mrs. Benè reported she was in attendance at a motivational speech given by Sarah Reinertsen, a graduate of Huntington High School who is an inspirational speaker contracted through the Arts-In-Education Program to speak to our students. Mrs. Benè attended one of the talks for the 9th 10th and 11th graders at the High School. She was pleased to see how engaged the students were. They asked many questions and seemed to get a lot from the experience.

Mrs. Rogan attended a fundraiser also arranged for through the Arts-In-Education Program, the Chinese Acrobats. The children loved the performance and there was a fair beforehand. Mrs. Rogan thanked the volunteers who helped with the fundraiser and the district for always thinking about the children.

Mrs. Rogan was a participant in the College Fair held at the High School. It was the first of its kind. There were tables set up representing various careers and students could come to discuss and ask questions of the various professionals. Mrs. Rogan represented the field of Journalism. Mrs. Rogan thanked Bernadette Walsh, Marcy Rhodes and Peter Paternostro for making this day possible.

Dr. Lacey attended the mid-winder concert at the High School. She thanked the students and teachers for a wonderful performance.

PUBLIC COMMENTARY

At the portion of the meeting set aside for public commentary Kevin Boyle, President of the United Public Service Employees Union, read a statement on behalf of the district's clerical, aides, monitors/assistants, custodial/buildings and grounds, and food service units imploring the district to settle the contracts as they have not yet been settled. Many members of these units were present.

ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION/ACTION

Dr. Lacey announced the presenters reporting on Academic Progress would be David Casamento, Director of Science and Joan Fretz, Director of the Performing Arts.

Academic Progress – Science

David Casamento gave a very informative and detailed presentation indicating test results, steps to improving test results and the direction he has taken the district in regard to Science research and competitions the students are competing in. The Board asked many questions; discussion followed.

Performing Arts

Mrs. Fretz made a very extensive presentation on the value of the arts for students. She included attendance statistics and academic performance statistics. She brought samples of art made by students and showed how the arts can identify strategies that can be useful teaching tools.

Huntington School District Assessed Valuation

Mr. Dwyer, Mr. Finello, and Mr. Grackin met with Bryan Monaghan, Assessor in the Town of Huntington on February 2, 2009. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the tax rate. Mr. Grackin explained how the tax rate is calculated and how it impacts the budget process. Extensive discussion followed which segued into a discussion on the budget target number for 2009-2010. Mr. Grackin asked the Board to decide upon a target rate increase so he would be able to present the first budget draft on March 2nd. Discussion followed. The Board agreed upon a 4 percent tax rate increase that would translate into approximately a 2 percent budget to budget increase.

9-Period or 8-Period Day

Mr. Dwyer introduced the ongoing topic of discussion, going from a 9-period day to an 8-period day at the high school. Mr. Finello indicated a memo had been given to the Board regarding this topic and explained how it came about. There were additional meetings with directors and administrative staff at the high school and what came of these meetings was a plan formulated by Dr. Leonardi and Mr. Noce. This plan essentially is a recommendation of an alternative method to reach the same kind of savings that would come from going to an 8-period day while maintaining the 9-period day. Dr. Lacey explained the benefits to the students in having the flexibility of a 9-period day. Dr. Leonardi and Mr. Noce answered questions and gave extensive details. Mr. Dwyer clarified with Dr. Leonardi and Mr. Noce that this plan is the preferred alternative based upon their professional opinion. Dr. Leonardi and Mr. Noce indicated there is a consensus that this plan could work. Mr. Dwyer thanked Dr. Leonardi and Mr. Noce for their efforts in coming up with such a creative plan.

CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION

A MOTION was made by Mrs. Rogan and seconded by Mrs. Brown to authorize administration to arrange for the provision of appropriate special education programs and services for students as enumerated in the CSE and CPSE minutes:
